Dear Friends,

As we return to some sense of normalcy in our daily lives, we have had the pleasure of witnessing our staff, clinicians, providers, volunteer program, and leadership work tirelessly alongside one another to ensure the health and well-being of our patients and communities. The year was not without its challenges, but there were some much-needed periods of relief along the continued roller coaster ride that we, and all in the medical field, continued to endure as we continued to provide care to our communities amid adjusting to the realities of unwinding from a pandemic.

One of the programs we were excited about launching this year, was our Centering Pregnancy initiative. Centering is patient – centered care and visits are scheduled with expecting mothers that allow for flexibility and time to explore health and wellness topics that are pertinent to various groups. Centering Pregnancy decreases the rate of preterm and low weight babies, increases breastfeeding rates, and leads to better pregnancy spacing. In addition, Centering Pregnancy has been shown to nearly eliminate racial disparities in preterm birth. African American women, who are at a higher risk for preterm birth in the US, experience lower risk of preterm birth when enrolled in Centering Pregnancy than in traditional care.

We were also proud of increasing access to healthy food, by expanding the work being done at our Free Farmers Market. Our Free Food Fair now takes place weekly, as we have increased distribution to two other schools in the area. We were able to accomplish this through the purchase of a box truck with the help and support of donors like you. Our Free Food Fair last year alone served 18,703 community members and distributed 335,560 pounds of produce. This is now one of the largest food distribution efforts in South LA.

As you will see in this year's annual report, our dedicated team at UMMA continue to wear their hearts on their sleeve in every aspect of their work. They were able to accomplish such meaningful work and projects that contribute to a healthy and flourishing community.

This remarkable work and continued dedication by our staff truly highlights the fact that UMMA's work, with your support, is critical now more than ever.


WHO WE ARE



OUR MISSION

UMMA Community Clinic was founded in the wake of the 1992 Los Angeles civil unrest, when several University of California, Los Angeles medical and graduate students decided to use their talents and skills to help heal the devastating social, emotional, and economic conditions revealed by the unrest. Today, we are a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) and Patient Centered Medical Home (PCMH) with a staff of 80 employees who provide an array of integrated healthcare services through **29,085** annual patient visits.

For over 25 years, we have been working to ensure that the social, medical, and behavioral health needs of South Los Angeles residents are met. We function as an innovative health center working to achieve health equity not only through integrated primary care, behavioral health, and oral health services, but also through unique health education programming and groundbreaking community engagement initiatives, including our Health on Wheels Initiative and Food Insecurity Initiative.



SOCIAL AND COMMUNITY CONTEXT

We view the social determinants of health (SDOH) as interrelated and our work as part of a larger push toward systemic health equity. We strive to be at the forefront of the social landscape fighting for health and justice.



MEDICAL SERVICES

PRIMARY CARE

Our primary care services include pediatric care; men's and women's healthcare; family planning; health education; non-urgent medical care; routine physical exams; screening, diagnosis, and treatment of acute illnesses; and detection, monitoring, and treatment of chronic illnesses such as diabetes, hypertension, and asthma.

In 2022, we saw significant improvements in our screenings for diabetes control, hypertension control, breast cancer, and chlamydia.




MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH

Our Prenatal Clinic aims to ensure a positive birth outcome for all our pregnant mothers and a healthy start for all babies ages 0 to 3 years. Our newly incorporated "CenteringPregnancy" and "CenteringParenting" group visit model of care allows for true transformation in our care delivery by increasing patient engagement, building on patient's own skillsets, expanding community connections, enhancing access to our Comprehensive Perinatal Services Program (CPSP), and empowering pregnant women and new mothers in South Los Angeles to take charge of their own health. We served **181** prenatal patients in 2022.


EXPANSION PROJECTS

VERMONT CLINIC

Architectural plans were approved by the city of Los Angeles for our new Vermont Clinic. We started construction in December 2022, scheduled to be completed the first quarter of 2023.









HIV PREVENTION INITIATIVE

We are expanding access to HIV prevention services in South Los Angeles by decreasing the risk of HIV transmission. We are preventing new HIV infections through increased testing and counseling, linkage to treatment, and PrEP prescriptions when clinically indicated.

BLACK VISIONS OF WELLNESS



Black Visions of Wellness (BVOW) is a program designed to support African/African American communities by providing access to traditional and non-traditional care. We strengthen African and African American communities through services that encourage physical health, mental well-being and recovery. We aim to address chronic health conditions, substance use problems, trauma, depression, and stress. We served more than **150** community members.

STUDENT HEALTH LEADERS



We help to inspire future generations to serve as peer-health advocates. Our Student Health Leaders program is geared towards engaging and empowering John C. Fremont High School youth through health education and campus-wide campaigns to promote the services available at our UMMA Teen Clinic and foster a healthier community.

- Student Health Leaders attend weekly meetings, conduct peer health presentations, table at health-related events, and lead our monthly Teen Clinic Talks with John C. Fremont High School students.
- Student Health Leaders highlight important health issues related to lifestyle, behavioral health, UMMA Teen Clinic services, and COVID-19 vaccination through our @UMMATeenClinic Instagram account.



DENTAL CLINIC



We hosted our Fremont Family Dental Clinic Ribbon-Cutting Ceremony in partnership with the Los Angeles Unified School District.

Our Fremont Family Dental Clinic opened on the John C. Fremont High School campus in April 2022. Dental services include routine dental check-ups, teeth cleaning and fluoride application, application of sealants to molar teeth in a child's mouth to prevent cavities, full mouth treatment for serious tooth decay, and complete dental treatment. We are proud to offer this much-needed service to our South Los Angeles community.

We provided 696 dental visits.




INDIVIDUAL DONORS
